Paul Butler is a law professor at Georgetown University and former prosecutor with the United States Department of Justice. Professor Butler researches and teaches in the areas of criminal law, race and the law, and critical theory. He is the author of *Let's Get Free: A Hip-Hop Theory of Justice* (2009), and his scholarship has been published in many leading scholarly journals, including the Yale Law Journal, the Harvard Law Review, the Stanford Law Review and the UCLA Law Review. He is one of the U.S.'s most frequently consulted authorities on race and criminal justice, and his scholarship has been the subject of much attention in the academic and popular media. He also has written a column for The Legal Times and has published numerous op-ed articles and book reviews, including in The New York Times, The Washington Post, and The Los Angeles Times.
